

THOUSAND OAKS BOULEVARD UTILITY UNDERGROUNDING PROJECT

Construction work for the Thousand Oaks Boulevard Utility Undergrounding Project will begin this month. The project is a part of a long-planned effort to modernize and improve the Boulevard by removing 48 electrical poles and all associated overhead communication and cable lines along a 1.5-mile portion of Thousand Oaks Boulevard between Duesenberg Drive and Via Merida. There will be periodic lane closures in order to install the new facilities.

DOG LICENSE CANVASSING

Representatives from the City's animal control agency, Los Angeles County Animal Care and Control, will be canvassing City neighborhoods checking for unlicensed dogs during the first few weeks of March. The Thousand Oaks Municipal Code requires that all dogs four months of age and older be up to date on rabies vaccinations and dog licenses.


Dog licenses cost \$20 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$60 for non-spayed or neutered. Additionally, there is a \$30 late fee for not renewing a dog license prior to its expiration, and a \$40 field enforcement fee if an animal is found unlicensed during canvassing. The field enforcement fee can be avoided by obtaining a license for your dog through Los Angeles County Animal Care and Control.

CITY COUNCIL APPROVES GROUNDWATER STUDY

As part of an effort to seek additional sources of water for Thousand Oaks, at its February 23, 2016 meeting, City Council approved a Groundwater Study. The study, concluded that groundwater can be developed to replace up to 10 percent of the imported water the City receives from Calleguas Municipal Water District, the County's water wholesale agency.



101/23 FREEWAY INTERCHANGE UPDATE

Crews will continue reducing lanes along northbound and southbound US 101 throughout the project area, nightly Sunday through Thursday between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m., for the next two to three weeks. These lane closures are needed as crews work on improvements to the center median. At least one lane along northbound and southbound US 101 will remain open at all times; more information about these closures can be found on the project <u>Google</u> <u>map</u>.

As crews continue their efforts in the center median barrier of US 101, the center median divider will also be realigned to accommodate the freeway widening. Crews will be performing



roadway excavation activity and grinding asphalt in the median at night.

This year's race will begin May 15th and end on May 22nd. The Amgen Tour of California will be coming through Thousand Oaks on May 17th during Stage 3 of the course.


