1 Support grants to Social Services providers.	May-08	CDD	Budget	Completed - On May 13, 2008, City Council approved grants for 2-year funding period. The City annually uses 15% of its Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) entitlement from the Department of Housing and Urban Development in FY 2007 (\$105,219), plus \$100,000 from local Social Services Endowment Fund (SSEF) for grant to approximately 32 non-profit providers of public and social services primarily to low income residents. These City-assisted programs benefit households at-risk for homelessness, families in crisis, those without health insurance, seniors, disabled persons and a variety of youth activities.
2 Continue subsidized full-day pre-school.	Ongoing	CDD	Budget	Completed/Ongoing - The City annually receives funding from the California Department of Education to subsidize half-day and full day pre-school activities for children from low income households. In FY 2007, the City received \$616,136 to subsidize pre-school for approximately 110 very low-income households. Ongoing for FY 2008-09.

3 Continue subsidized pre-school at City's Thousand Oaks Child Care Center.	Ongoing	CDD	Budget	Completed/Ongoing - The City annually receives funding from the California Department of Education to subsidize half-day and full day pre-school activities for children from low income households at two locations, the City-owned Thousand Oaks Child Care Center (110 So. Conejo School Road) and Roots and Wings Family Development Center (1942 Calle Tulipan). In FY 2007, the City received \$616,136 to subsidize pre-school for approximately 110 very low-income households. Ongoing for FY 2008-09.
4 Continue subsidized instructional materials for pre-school sites.	Ongoing	CDD	Budget	Completed/Ongoing - Subsidized instruction materials are provided at both Roots and Wings and City's Center. Ongoing for FY 2008-09.
5 Continue subsidized pre-K resources for pre-school sites.	Ongoing	CDD	Budget	Completed/Ongoing - Subsidized pre-K resources for pre-school available at both Roots and Wings and the City's Center. Ongoing for FY 2008-09.
