Hello,

This note is to provide feedback regarding the proposed increase in water rates for Thousand Oaks CA.

As stated in the proceeding, homeowners will be hit with multiple increases starting with 16.3% then 3.4% and then 3.0% over the next 3 years [or 7.5% /yr]. Meanwhile a notice of increase from the city of T.O. stated an increase of 5.1% and then 4.6% within the next 2 years.

If my math is correct that an increase of 32.4% within 3 years! This doesn't include the increase for wastewater. Are customers going to be burdened with increases from both local and wholesale providers?

I've lived in Thousand Oaks for 8 years and Ventura County for 20+ years and it seems every year the rates go up. I realize that we've had to deal with several years of drought and most residents have made great strides in conserving

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water and to keep their cost down. However the proposed increase seems to be more focused on the stockholders and not providing a fair price-point that's affordable for most customers.

Like many I consider water as a necessity and not a luxury, but sadly seems to be a business modeled for profit. In my opinion it should be a non-profit industry, but I know that'll never happen. As known we have a tiered system for those that don't mind paying more to maintain landscaping. Many in my neighborhood can't afford water at the rates currently in place so they let their landscaping die and it has taken a toll. We're getting to look more like Palm Springs with each passing year.

I'm guessing the city like end users don't have the ability to shop around and wholesalers know this. That's why I'm taking the time to write, I feel that customers are being taken advantage of with no real justification for the increase. I'm not familiar with the wholesale market, but if Cal American has a monopoly, they're holding all the cards and the CPUC is the only advocate for the end users.

Bottom-line: Please consider that this proposal unfairly burdens Thousand Oaks customers that already pay a lot for water and with more local increases already in the pipeline.
