Potential VCTC Sales Tax - VCCM Recommendations

1. Investment/Spending Plan – 50% for Local Streets & Roads

It was the unanimous consensus that the annual share of funds delineated toward "Local Streets & Roads" be no less than 50% of the total, as per the following:

2. Allocation of the Local Streets & Roads 50% Share – Based on a "Blended Formula"

It was the unanimous consensus that the allocation of the Local Streets & Roads 50% share should be based on a "blended" formula which takes into consideration factors such as population, road lane miles, and sales tax generation ("return to source"). County representatives presented a case for a set-aside prior to the division by blending proposed by the cities. The recommended "blended formula" will be worked out at next VCCM meeting and before VCTC Board takes action.

The Ventura County Transportation Commission executive director will receive a 14.5 percent annual salary raise over the next two years, going from \$205,871 to \$235,703.

The commission's board on Friday approved the hike retroactive to June 1, when Darren Kettle's annual salary went from \$205,871 to \$220,283. It will increase to \$235,703 on June 1, 2016. The raises follow Kettle's latest performance evaluation completed May 1.

Kettle has been executive director since 2007 and before Friday had received only two cost-ofliving increases, totaling 5.5 percent, according to the commission's general counsel, Steve Mattas.

"I'm absolutely grateful" for the latest salary boosts, Kettle said Monday. "I love my job and when the job I do is recognized with a little bit more compensation, it shows that I'm appreciated. And I appreciate that."
