I was just notified that the City Council has recommended to discontinue the crossing guard service at the intersection of Kimber Drive @ Baxter Road - Maple Elementary School. I am hoping that this does NOT happen.

The crossing guard provides a much needed service to my children and other families of this school. The intersection is extremely busy during the morning and afternoon hours of drop-off and pick-up for the elementary school. Cars do not pay attention to the flashing road lights and sometimes they do not pay attention to the people crossing the crosswalk either. Lights are a great addition to the crosswalk, but they do not take the place of an actual human being helping to escort the kids and adults across the intersection. If you had a child that was waiting to cross that intersection, during drop-off and pick-up hours, you would change your minds about not having a crossing guard there to help. I hope that the City Council will re-consider this idea and chose to keep a crossing guard at this school.
