CANCELLATION OF BOIL WATER NOTICE

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

On Tuesday, February 18, 2020 you were notified of the need to boil/disinfect all tap water used for drinking and cooking purposes.

The City of Thousand Oaks' Water System in conjunction with the State Water Resources Control Board, and/or the Ventura County Local Environmental Health Jurisdiction, has determined that, through abatement of the health hazard and comprehensive testing of the water, **your water is safe to drink. It is no longer necessary to boil your tap water or for you to consume bottled water.** We apologize for any inconvenience and thank you for your patience during this process.

Water Testing Update:

In the Boil Water Notice you were notified that passing bacteriological sample results needed to be verified before confirming that the water is safe to drink. Bacteriological samples were taken throughout the affected area on Tuesday morning, February 18, 2020. On Wednesday morning, February 19, 2020, a second set of bacteriological samples were also taken per the State Water Resources Control Board's guidance. On Thursday morning, February 20, 2020 all of the results were finalized, and it was confirmed that all of the samples passed, and they had good disinfection residuals. The presence of good disinfectant residuals combined with the absence of bacteriological contamination confirm that the water was and is safe to drink.
