



WILDFIRE EVACUATION CHECKLIST

- ✓ Water-one gallon per person, per day (3-day supply)
- ✓ Food-nonperishable, easy-to-prepare items (3-day supply)
- ✓ First aid kit and extra batteries
- ✓ Medications and medical items
- ✓ Multi-purpose tool
- ✓ Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- ✓ Cell phone with chargers
- ✓ Gloves

- ✓ Copies of personal documents (medication list and pertinent medical information, deed/lease to home, birth certificates, insurance policies) on a flash drive
- ✓ Family and emergency contact information
- ✓ Extra cash
- ✓ Emergency blanket
- ✓ N95 rated face mask
- ✓ Portable generator

Go-Bag

- Flashlight/headlamp
- Local map with walking paths
- Water, snacks
- Important documents
- Emergency blanket
- Cash
- Battery powered radio or hand cranked radio, extra batteries
- Whistle
- Change of clothing
- Wallet, cell phone and charger

Prepare Your Home

- Shut all inside doors
- Raise shades and remove curtains
- Turn on inside lights
- Shut off air conditioning
- Close/seal ground and attic vents
- Move furniture away from walls
- Put a ladder at the corner of house for firefighters

Receive Alerts

- Visit VCemergency.com for updated info for your area
- Sign up for emergency notifications at VCAlert.org
- Tune into the following stations: KVEN 1450AM, KCLU 88.3FM, KHAY 100.7FM, KMLA 103.7FM
- Change your cell phone outgoing voicemail message so callers know you are okay.
- Update your status on social media and register with the American Red Cross Safe & Well site.

Check on Others

- Help neighbors evacuate and which way to go
- Ask if they have a plan to get out safely
- Offer help for those who need it
- Take your pets with you
- Learn and practice first aid skills and emergency response via Thousand Oaks [CERT](#) or [DART](#) training programs.

Grab Extra Items

- Wear heavy shoes, cotton clothing, and a dry bandanna
- Computers, electronics and chargers
- Medications, prescriptions, and medical devices
- Family treasures, art, photo albums
- Pet carriers/leashes, vaccination records and pet food

Proper use of a Fire Extinguisher

			
<p>Pull the extinguisher's safety pin</p>	<p>Aim the extinguisher at the source of the flames</p>	<p>Squeeze the trigger and hold it</p>	<p>Sweep the source of the flames until the extinguisher runs dry</p>

	Fire Type	Extinguisher Type	Extinguisher Identification	Symbol
A	Ordinary combustibles: wood, paper, rubber, fabrics and many plastics	Water, Dry Power, Halon		
B	Flammable liquids and Gases: gasoline, oils, paint, lacquer, and tar, turpentine	Carbon Dioxide, Dry Power, Halon		
C	Fires involving Live Electrical Equipment	Carbon Dioxide, Dry Powder, Halon
